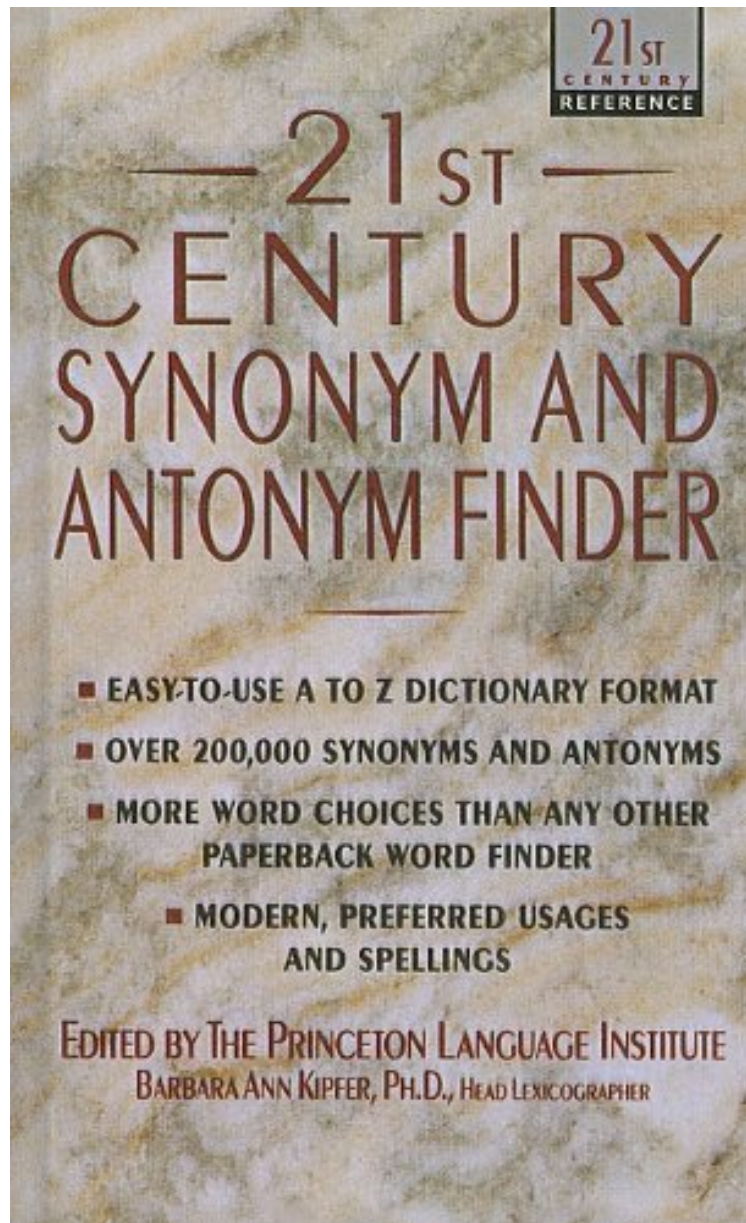

Wordwise, it's not 100% complete, but for convenience, portability and content, it's perfect for my needs.
