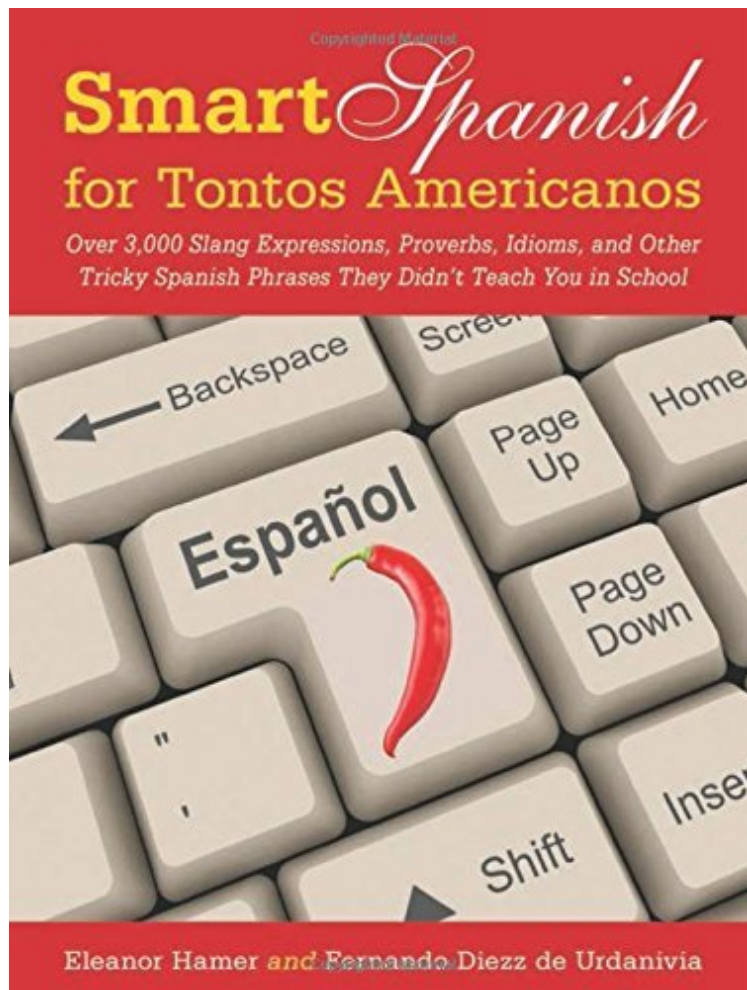

The organization takes a little bit to get used to, but the content is good. It's especially full of Mexican phrases that are each marked with a little flag icon. Definitely a good book for the Spanish-learner who is wanting to get away from more word-by-word translations. Even if what you're saying is correct, sometimes it's just not how a native speaker would say it.

There's a difference between learning a language and being able to speak it with the familiarity of a native speaker. This book fills that gap, clarifying tricky words and expressions and illuminating the finer points of Spanish wordplay and double meanings.
